Health and Hygiene Procedures

Children have the right to good quality health care – the best health care possible – to safe drinking water, nutritious food, a clean and safe environment, and information to help them stay healthy. (United Nations Conventions on Rights of the Child - Article 24)

Daily

- Any equipment found to be broken or faulty will be removed, repaired or disposed of.
- Clean any equipment which has been in contact with bodily fluids as per instruction in Health Protection Scotland Infection.
- Dishwasher loaded and emptied at end of each session.
- Children's snack aprons are cleaned with hot soapy water after use.
- Messy overalls and art aprons washed at least weekly or when required.
- Dishes are dried with disposable blue roll.
- Fridge and freezer temperatures recorded at the beginning of each session.
- Water tray emptied at the end of each session and washed with hot soapy water and dried thoroughly with paper towels.
- Toilet/changing table is cleaned between sessions.

Weekly

- Overalls, dressing up costumes and spare hats and gloves washed.
- Stock rotation of stored foods.
- Fridge, freezer, oven, microwave, blender and toaster cleaned.
- Toys that are suitable to go through the dishwasher are washed in this way. Other toys are washed with hot soapy water and dried thoroughly before storing away.
- Toothbrush buses to be cleaned.

Termly

- Freezer defrosted and cleaned.
- Sand tray emptied and washed with hot soapy water and dried thoroughly.
- All large washable equipment is washed.

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
